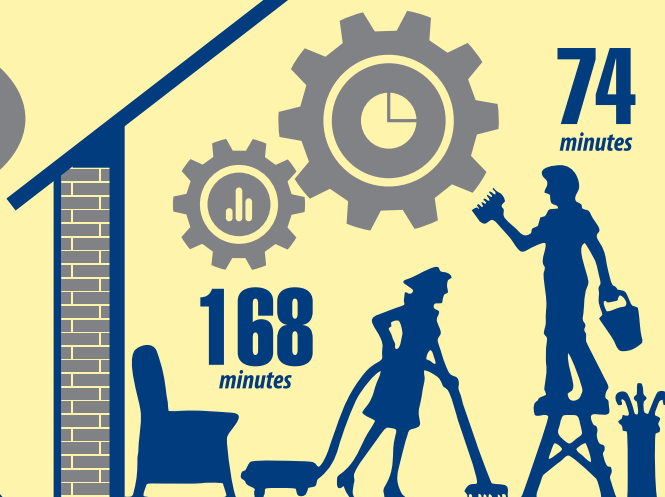
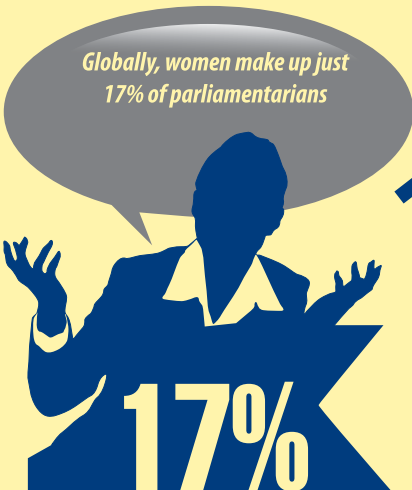


WE CAN ALL CONTRIBUTE TO A MORE EQUAL AND BETTER WORLD



Women occupy only 40% of middle management and 29% of top management positions



Women do 168 minutes a day of housework, men 74 minutes



Women average 158 minutes a day on paid work, men spend 259 minutes in the workplace



Women produce up to 80% of food in developing countries, but are more likely to be hungry than men, and are often denied the right to own land

Only 8,74% of the MAYORS in SEE were female and 91,26% male (2011)



Even more striking was the fact that three of the countries did not have a single female mayor

In the CONSTITUTIONAL BODIES of NALAS the gender balance is achieved in the Committee of Liaison Officers, Executive Bureau, the Task Forces, and the Secretariat

However, at the level of NALAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY only 2 out of 32 delegates are women



NALAS and its member Associations are committed to promote gender equality:

NALAS has developed and implements its Gender and Youth Strategy

NALAS and 9 of its member Associations have supported the European Charter for Equality of Women and Men in Local Life, and are willing to commit to action planning for its implementation

Some Associations have their own committees for gender equality and others cooperate with national bodies and commissions

Almost all have implemented projects or have been partners in projects targeting gender equality

CALM has created a Network of CALM Women whose members are female mayors, counsellors and other representatives of local authorities
